MTUS origins in the 1970s

- Jonathan Gershuny discovered minimally used time use surveys – stored in collections of uncatalogued floppy disks, box files, and paper diaries stored in bags
 - BBC Audience Research Unit
 - Szalai materials
 - Young & Wilmott symmetrical family
 - Mass Observation
- Idea for harmonised archive MTUS





What is MTUS?

- Multinational Time Use Study www.timeuse.org/MTUS
- Most comprehensive harmonised time use data
- Cross-time, 1960s to 2010s
- Cross-national 25 countries
- Created by Jonathan Gershuny with help of Sally Jones in early 1980s
- Evolving iterations

Early MTUS

- Designed for time budget analysis (summary time in detailed main activities), mostly for gender and national accounting purposes
- Summary time over 24 hours in 41 and 20 main activities + limited set of background variables
- Each row case represented a diary, no consideration of households & multi-diaries
- Ages 18-60 only (for analysis of care of children, activities of working aged people, full economy)





American Heritage Time Use Study - Origins

- Initiated by Yale University as a part of a Program on Non-Market Accounts funded by the Glaser Progress Foundation in 2006
- CTUR commissioned to harmonise major USA time use surveys from the 1960s, the 1970s, the 1980s and the 1990s with the 2003 initial American Time Use Survey
- Served as a trial run to make the episode files in the MTUS





AHTUS – MTUS differences

- All USA datasets in AHTUS also are in MTUS
- AHTUS has some different background variables, though there are more variables in MTUS than in the AHTUS
- AHTUS includes more activity codes (92) compared to MTUS 69; AHTUS also more who else was present categories
- MTUS has marker for use of internet / internet enabled devices not in the AHTUS





AHTUS – MTUS differences

- AHTUS has main files for adults aged 18+ and from main surveys, with supplementary files for the spouse element of the 1975-76 survey and supplementary files for diaries from children aged <18
- MTUS also has aged 18+ and aged<18 files, but integrates all diaries collected from each survey, including merging spouse diaries with main respondent diaries in the 1975-76 survey

Professor Jonathan Gershuny first developed the Multinational Time Use Study (MTUS) in the mid 1970s. While working at the University of Bath with Sally Jones, Professor Gershuny developed a single dataset with common series of background variables and total time spent per day in 41 activities. The original MTUS allowed comparison of British time use data with the 1965 Szalai Multinational Time Budget Study and data from Canada and Denmark. The MTUS since has grown to offer harmonised episode and context information and to encompass over 60 datasets from 25 countries, including recent data from the HETUS, ATUS, and other national level time use projects. Professor Gershuny and Dr Kimberly Fisher presently manage the study in collaboration with other time use scholars.

This site provides access to the MTUS data and documentation, and offers advice on the use of this dataset.

In July 2013, we have:

- Renamed the W60 file to Harmonised Episode File (HEF) the new name more clearly marks the file content
- Renamed the W58 file to Harmonised Aggregate File (HAF) the new name more clearly marks the file content
- Offered a new Harmonised Simple File (HSF). This file covers a more limited range of person-level, household level and diary
 variables, and includes summary time in 25 time use categories. All files in the HEF and HAF also appear in this file. We temporarily
 have moved all files presently included in all older versions of the MTUS into this new format, until we can upgrade the older
 surveys properly. We will add some new datasets only in this format.
- · added the 2012 American Time Use Survey in the Harmonised Episode File and Harmonised Aggregate File
- added Spain 2009-2010 in the Harmonised Episode File and Harmonised Aggregate File
- · added Denmark 2001 in the Harmonised Simple File
- added Republic of Korea 2009 in the Harmonised Simple File
- · added a region supplement for France
- upgraded the USA 1998-99 and combined this with the USA 1999-2001 into the Harmonised Episode File and Harmonised Aggregate
 File
- · corrected some coding errors in the location variables in the first and last episodes of Israel 1991-92
- corrected some coding errors and added the East/West distinction in Germany 2001-02
- . corrected errors in the assignment of the travel categories in the Basque country data for 2002-03 and 2008
- · corrected errors in the original UK 2000-01 data reflecting the date and order diaries were kept

Some amendments to this dataset made from December 2005 through December 2010 were funded by the Economic and Social Research Council ().

 released the 2011 ATUS data

MTUS / AHTUS harmonisation process: diary narratives

- Missing main activity not always missing
- Reading diary as a narrative
 - activity in sequences (following sleep or eating)

4:00-8:30 sleep home

8:30-8:40 home

8:40-8:50 commute walk

8:50-9:20 commute train

9:20-12:30 paid work, main job office





Harmonisation process

- Data cleaning and correction
 - Techniques to fix errors not available in past
 - Sequencing techniques relatively new, can enhance data as well as analyse data
- Create variables possible for a large number of national sample time use surveys
- Enhance files by moving information recorded by respondents to all relevant elements of diaries (can involve grouping as well as breaking down of original codes)



MTUS harmonisation process

- Make survey-level supplementary files (region & ethnicity, extra variable for UK and USA)
- Documentation
 - Main file over-all
 - Survey-specific variable comments
 - Survey specific code maps
 - Survey metadata summary
 - Annotated code files that start with original data files and end saving final MTUS files



While working at the University of Bath with Sally Jones, Professor Gershuny developed a single dataset with common series of background variables and total time spent per day in 41 activities. The original MTUS allowed comparison of British time use data with the 1965 Szalai Multinational Time Budget Study and data from Canada and Denmark. The MTUS since has grown to offer harmonised episode and context information and to encompass over 60 datasets from 25 countries, including recent data from the HETUS, ATUS, and other national level time use projects. Professor Gershuny and Dr Kimberly Fisher presently manage the study in collaboration with other time use scholars.

This site provides access to the MTUS data and documentation, and offers advice on the use of this dataset.

In July 2013, we have:

- Renamed the W60 file to Harmonised Episode File (HEF) the new name more clearly marks the file content
- · Renamed the W58 file to Harmonised Aggregate File (HAF) the new name more clearly marks the file content
- Offered a new Harmonised Simple File (HSF). This file covers a more limited range of person-level, household level and diary
 variables, and includes summary time in 25 time use categories. All files in the HEF and HAF also appear in this file. We temporarily
 have moved all files presently included in all older versions of the MTUS into this new format, until we can upgrade the older
 surveys properly. We will add some new datasets only in this format.

At present we are working on upgrading the remaining older surveys from Finland, Germany, South Africa, the UK and USA, and adding surveys from Finland, Spain and the Republic of Korea.


